

Southern Cascade™

Lomandra hystrix 'LHWP' (b)



A weeping *Lomandra* that handles full sun to heavy shade.

- A more compact form than the standard hystrix, Southern Cascade™ *Lomandra* is well suited in tropical to cold regions and is ideal for rain gardens.
- Southern Cascade™ *Lomandra* has large fragrant yellow male flowers that will not produce seed.
- Will handle periods of wet feet and is drought tolerant. It is one of the only native plants able to handle wet heavy shade conditions.
- Can handle periods of moderate frosts, has survived a period of down to -4° celsius.
- When planting make sure a reasonable amount of 8–9 month slow release fertiliser is used, especially in poor nutrient soils.

Note: 'LHWP' is sold under the brand name *Tropic Cascade*™ in Queensland, Northern and Central NSW. It is ideally suited to both the northern and southern states, so it has been named to suit the different regions.



Description	Compact, weeping <i>Lomandra hystrix</i>
Density	2–6 plants per m ² 1.5–3 per linear metre
Height & Width	60–80cm x 60–80cm (maintains smaller height when cut back every 3–4 years)
Flowering	Sterile male yellow flowers from Sep–Nov
Best Planting Time	March–November
Uses	Specimen/mass plantings for residential or commercial use
Position	Full sun to heavy shade Tolerates humidity, drought & moderate frost
Soil Type	Most soil types
Care	Water as required for 8–13 weeks until established; use slow release fertiliser in spring; cut back 30cm above the ground every 3 to 7 years
