

Cherry Cluster™

Grevillea rhyolitica x *juniperina* 'TWD01' ♂

NATIVE SHRUBS & GROUND COVERS

Clean, tidy foliage with masses of showy cherry flowers.

- Mass clusters of cherry flowers in autumn, winter and spring. The colour will brighten up any garden.
- Drought tolerant and frost hardy, tested to -5° celsius.
- Its toughness makes it great for mass plantings, native gardens and rockeries with showy flowers.
- Prune Cherry Cluster™ *Grevillea* as required and only use a native or slow release fertiliser sparingly.
- The cross between *Grevillea rhyolitica* and *Grevillea juniperina* will change the way you see *Grevilleas*.
- Cherry Cluster™ *Grevillea* gains its toughness and slightly broader leaf from *Grevillea rhyolitica* and its excellent ground cover form from *Grevillea juniperina*.

Description	Tough ground cover
Density	2-3 plants per m ²
Height & Width	50cm x 80cm
Flowering	Attractive red flowers from Mar-Nov
Best Planting Time	March-November
Uses	Mass planting, native gardens and rockeries
Position	Full sun to part shade; tolerates drought & frost
Soil Type	Well drained soils, pH below 7
Care	Water as required for 8-13 weeks until established; prune if required every 2-3 years; use a native or slow release fertiliser sparingly
Where it Works	ACT, VIC, TAS, SA, WA, NSW (best suited Sydney and south, will work in some parts of Northern NSW) & parts of South East QLD (non humid regions like Toowoomba)
