Correa pulchella 'COR11' ↴

NATIVE SHRUBS & GROUND COVERS

Brilliant orange/red flowers with very dense foliage and minimal pruning.

- Fire Bells™ *Correa* is a compact pulchella type with intense, vibrant flowers.
- Finishing great in pots with no or minimal pruning, this showy *Correa* will be sought after for the landscape for its compact growth habit especially in smaller gardens.

Description	Very compact, dense ground cover
Density	2-5 plants per m ² 2-3 plants per linear metre
Height & Width	25cm x 80cm (smaller with pruning)
Flowering	Vibrant orange/red bells in winter/early spring
Best Planting Time	Autumn, winter or spring
Uses	For bird attracting gardens, dense ground cover for small gardens, or containers for patios
Position	Full sun to light shade Tolerates drought & frost
Soil Type	Preferably reasonably drained soil
Care	Water as needed for 8-13 weeks until established; low water requirements once established; prune once a year to maintain semi-compact habit or twice per year for a manicured appearance; fertilise with a slow release native fertiliser
Where it Works	VIC, ACT, SA, WA, TAS, Southern NSW and Sydney (in good draining soils)
